OUR FOUNDATION

Dear Lions,

When service projects are too large for a club or a district to financially support, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is there to assist. A great example of Lions and LCIF working together happens in the midst of disaster.

This summer, the world watched as natural disasters struck around the world. In South Asia, parts of India, Nepal and Bangladesh are experiencing devastating monsoon rains. In Mumbai alone, over 1,000 people have been reported killed in the floods. In the past 3 months, LCIF has approved 20 emergency grants to South Asia, totaling US\$125,000. In July, flooding in Japan took lives and destroyed homes. LCIF awarded a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant to help the community recover.

In August, Hurricane Harvey devastated the Texas coast stretching from the Houston area into Louisiana. During one of the worst natural disasters in American history, thousands of people lost their homes and everything they own. Some people lost family members. LCIF immediately awarded a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant to assist in reconstruction efforts. Within two weeks of Hurricane Harvey, Hurricane Irma struck Florida and other areas of the Southeast United States, and destroyed much of the islands in the western Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea. At the same time, Mexico was hit by its strongest earthquake in 100 years. LCIF has made funds available for two more US\$100,000 grants to aid Lions assisting with Hurricane Irma and Mexico's earthquake. Most recently, LCIF awarded a US\$100,000 grant to support Puerto Rico hurricane relief and reconstruction in the wake of Hurricane Maria.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to the individuals affected by these and other natural disasters. At the same time, LCIF issues a heart-felt thank you to our donors. Please consider joining them and making a contribution. Donations will continue Lions' relief efforts around the world, and no gift is too small.

Many times we, along with the Allgoods were asked, "Isn't it hard giving these dogs up?" Of course it is, but we do it because it is needed. I taught the Blind and Visually Impaired for 37 years, so I fully understand the need. We also wondered how these dogs are helping someone see a brighter future. Our wonders became known recently at Pilot Dog's Tailgate Party. The speaker that evening had Roxy, the Black Lab the Allgoods raised and trained. Rocky was the brother raised by us. We often took the litter mates to spend time with each other for socializing. We also used each other for a support system.

That evening there were Ohio Lions at the Party who know how emotional Roxy's owner's story was. She spoke of her story of losing her sight, not getting any help or hope from anyone, and how she and her husband found out about Pilot Dogs. She received cane training and Orientation and Mobility from Pilot Dogs. Then when it came time to meet Roxy, she went right up to her and licked her hand. That's when she knew she had her Guide Dog, saying, "That's my girl." Roxy has become her best friend, enabling her to travel around the country for her job, run marathons as well as going anywhere she needs to go.

And that is why we along with the many others are Pilot Puppy raisers who give their time and money to train, socialize and finally give them up. A Guide Dog restores hope for those who have lost all hope. It is also why so many of our Lions Clubs donate to help Pilot Dogs. It takes funds to train the dogs to be placed and many people to puppy raise. So help where you can. You can encourage your clubs to give throughout the year. You can send in your own personal donation as well. Also, consider being a puppy raiser. 


