After that it's the highest ranking officers on down.

ALL DISTRICT 13 OH4 LIONS CLUBS Voting of issues during the upcoming annual district convention

In compliance with District 13 OH4 Constitution and By-Laws, notice is hereby given as per Article VI, Section 8 of the Constitution that consideration **by formal voting** will take place on two (2) resolutions. This voting session will occur (sometime) during Saturday's business meeting with each resolution considered separately.

Resolution #1
District Project, known as STEPS,
for Pediatric Cancer Research

This resolution is in support of, endorses and commits the Lions of District 13 OH4 to a program evolving from a **"visionary" project** by the 2017-2018 MD13 Council of Governors **and now a service commitment** by Lions Club International for Pediatric Cancer Research.

WHEREAS, the 2017-2018 Cabinet of District 13 OH4, just as each Lions Club, is obligated to further the purposes of LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL has amended Policy #6 to recognize Pediatric Cancer Research and seek the endorsement by our own Districts Lion Clubs.

WHEREAS, this policy will support the visionary project known as STEPS, in Ohio, which was created by the current MD13 Council of Governors. A project to bring awareness that funding is lacking in research for childhood cancers.

WHEREAS, Lions Clubs International recently announced its commitment to such a worthy cause (Pediatric Cancer Research) that they have made it a new service commitment.

BE IT RESOLVED, the District Cabinet has amended Policy #6 providing additional language and defining a new district project and seeks the District's Lions Clubs commitment in support of.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the previous/current language of Policy #6 is unchanged and the amended change is the insert of two new paragraphs: 1) The Lions of District 13-OH4 endorses and supports a District specific project known as STEPS. This project shall be an annual "fund raising" event dedicated to the (Ohio Lions state-wide) efforts for Pediatric Cancer Research.

2) The STEPS project will be conducted or coordinated by the District Activities Chairperson or a District representative, if required.

The Regional Lions Leadership Institute Level 3 (RLLI3) group of 2016 has chosen a Mobile Eye Screening Unit (MESU) as a legacy project. After the necessary funds are raised, the group will then turn the MESU over to the Ohio Lions Sight and Hearing (S&H) Foundation, a 501(c)3 organization. The S&H Foundation is working with the RLLI3 2016 Class in this project!

Project Mission

RLLI3 groups mission is to carry out our "WE SERVE" mission by purchasing the MESU so we can provide an expanded level of eye screening services to our communities throughout the State of Ohio

Project Funding

The project has been approved for a \$46,500 grant from LCIF. This grant requires that the RLLI Class raise \$46,500 to match the grant. To assist us in raising the funds, the RLLI3 group has decided to conduct a raffle with a grand prize of \$2,000.00, 2nd prize at \$1,000.00 and the 3rd prize of \$500.00! We are asking for your clubs' support by committing to purchasing or selling 5 tickets for the Van project. Your club as well as individual Lions and community members could purchase a ticket. Our group is asking each Lion and Lions Clubs to step on board and support us in this valuable project. How great it will be to reach out to people throughout the state that we wouldn't otherwise be able to eye screen?

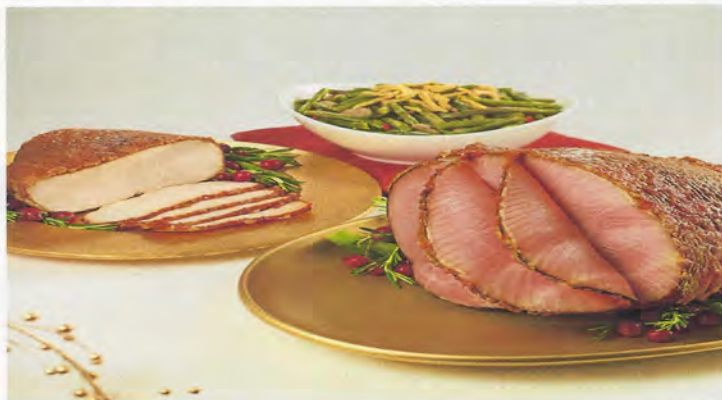
