District 13 OH4 Vision Screening

A big shout out to the Lions Clubs of District 13 OH4 for their work doing vision screening during the period July 2018 through June 2019. Most of these screenings were done in the schools and greatly help the overtaxed school health professionals. Adult screenings are conducted at health fairs, county fairs, veteran centers and various other locations and events. These screenings help many students and adults by identifying potential vision problems early so that the individuals can be referred to eye care professionals for further assessments and corrections. The following table shows a quick summary of the work done.
