The following excerpts are taken from an interview with Dr. Jung-Yul Choi by Kevin Jeong.

What does servant leadership mean to you?

Servant leadership is humble leadership. Humility is so important.

A great leader knows that they succeed only when they support the success of their team. They understand the strengths of their members—and also their needs. Whenever I meet Lions, I always ask, “How can I help you?” I think that’s something that can help everyone.

Encouragement is the greatest motivator. A pat on the back. A few words. Empower the people around you by supporting them. Give them the power to achieve and let them show you how much they are capable of.

Dr. Jung-Yul Choi interview continued.**Why is servant leadership important to you?**

I became a Lion in 1977—that's 42 years already! At every step of my journey, in leadership and as a Lion, I see how servant leadership has helped me to achieve my goals.

As a district governor, membership and clubs grew across my district. When the 95th international convention came to Busan in South Korea, it was the largest convention in Korean history.

These are great successes I have been part of. But it was only by servant leadership—only by supporting and encouraging my team—that so much was accomplished.

How does your message of “We Serve through Diversity” apply to leadership?

Our world is incredible in its diversity. We are all beautiful and unique in our experiences, abilities and culture. But we cannot let our differences divide us.

It's not easy to unite all the members of your club, your district or our association. But if we really want to change our communities, and the world, we must unite. We must find harmony. We must all work together. Because we are all in this world together.

As Lions, we share the same mission. To achieve our mission we must embrace diversity. To achieve our true potential as Lions, we must embrace it. I truly believe that diversity is our greatest strength.

Why do you think that ongoing training and professional development is important for Lions?

We are the greatest volunteer organization in the world. And why? Because of our members and their clubs. Who grows our membership? Club members. Who serves our communities? Clubs.

And how do we keep our members happy and our clubs healthy? Strong leadership.

In my experience, when someone with training becomes a leader there's a big difference. When we train Lions, we help them find the tools they need. We help them develop the unique skills that it takes to be a service leader. And then something special happens.

They become even more service-minded. They become even more willing to participate in service activities. They become even better Lions who are ready to lead their clubs and our communities, our districts and our world.

What are some practical ways to start becoming a servant leader today?

Top to bottom—that's how servant leadership works.

It means I support my district governors. It means that district governors support their club presidents. It means that club presidents support their members. If we can do this at all level of Lions, I believe that we will see extraordinary results in our membership and leadership.

And small things matter too. Speak kindly. Give encouragement. Recognize accomplishments. We all need it.

As your international president, wherever I go, I'm there to serve you. I'm going to do everything I can to help you succeed.

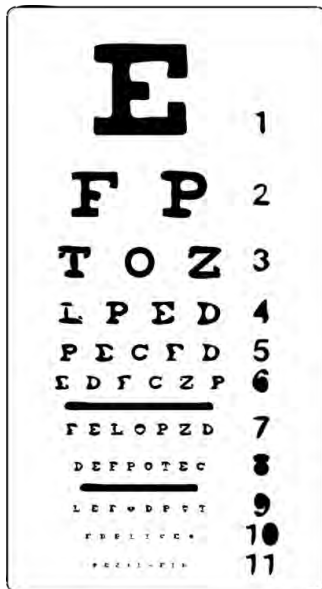

School Vision Screenings Underway in the District

Many school districts are stretched thin on staffing. Meeting state requirements for vision screening all students every other year stretches the staffs even more so. That's where Lions step in and help out in a big way. Many clubs have on-going programs with Lions doing the required distance and stereopsis (depth perception) tests. If students don't meet the minimum standards the medical staff will recheck and refer to a medical professional if necessary. As an example of the community benefit to these programs, as of the end of September, of the 20 days of scheduled school screenings in Kent and Ravenna, 10 days have been completed in 9 different schools. 1267 students have been screened with 239 students requiring further evaluation. Many clubs carry this even further by providing financial assistance for eye exams and glasses where needed. **We Serve!**



Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease that strikes children and adults suddenly. It has nothing to do with diet or lifestyle. You cannot prevent it—and there is currently no cure. If you have type 1 diabetes, you must constantly monitor your blood-sugar level, rely on injected or infused insulin and carefully monitor your eating and activity. Certified Guiding Lion Course

Guiding Lions are appointed by the district governor to guide a new club or help a rebuilding club for two years. Their responsibilities include assuring that the club officers are trained in their duties, that members receive orientation, and that the club conducts meaningful service projects, as well as motivating and supporting club growth. A Certified Guiding Lion Course gives willing Lions the knowledge and tools to provide effective guidance.

Even if you are an experienced Guiding Lion, you will benefit from this course because it provides the most comprehensive overview available of the roles and responsibilities of a Guiding Lion. The Certified Guiding Lion Course will help you understand your role as a Guiding Lion, help you develop a plan to assist a new club or struggling club, provide tools to help club officers manage their club, and locate the resources available to you and the club.

A **Certified Guiding Lion Course** will be conducted on **Saturday, October 19, 2019** at the **Knights of Columbus Hall** at **390 Garrett Street** in **Kent, Ohio**. Doors will open at 8:30 am and the **session will run from 9:00 am until Noon**. Light refreshments will be provided including coffee and water. There is **no charge** to attendees for this training.

Lions Clubs International (LCI) requires Certified Guiding Lions to **retake** the Certified Guiding Lion Course **every three years to maintain certification**. This course will conclude with the Test for Certified Guiding Lions and the Completion Verification Form to be submitted to LCI for you to become a Certified Guiding Lion.

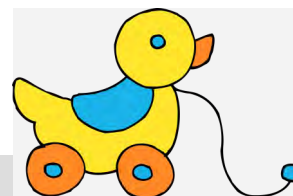

Large, quadrupedal stuffed animals - to serve as "fake dogs", "neutral dogs", or distractions

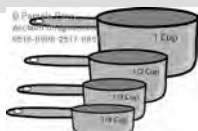
Things with wheels (skateboards, tricycles, bicycles, scooters, etc) - for socialization to things that dogs may have to walk next to or pass by in close proximity
