Again this club serves their community continuously with eye-glass referrals, 132 food baskets for families during Christmas time and are constantly reaching out to the school administration to help. As I write this submission, I am thinking about our PRIDE! After attending the Fun Winter retreat in Deer Creek with about 135 Lions, I was thinking about the opportunity we lost to advertise our International Association at a public venue. We had lots of fun, laughing and great meals! Many wore Lions attire but the item that kept me questioning our PRIDE was the lack of Ohio Lion's License Plates or Lions LOGO on our cars. There were 27 cars with the Lions Logo displayed. Hardly a celebration of Lionsim. Just a thought; if we drove in our communities with the special plate or even a decal or magnet displaying our Lions Logo, people will notice and respond with: 'Wow look at all the Lions plates! Looks like they are having a good time! How might I get involved with a group like the Lions?' Not to mention when a visitor comes to your meeting site they would know for sure they are in the correct meeting location. Lions emblems on our cars as either plates or other signage are an opportunity for us to recruit and make our community aware that the Lions in their community are an active group. That the Lions serve their community and are proud of their accomplishments and want more members with fresh ideas TO SERVE! Just a thought!

So my challenge to you this month is to find a way to make your club more visible. If you get the license plate it will cost you an additional \$25.00 from your normal renewal fee. Mine was \$77.50 as the Mahoning county fee normally is \$52.50 plus the \$25.00 for the special plate. From the additional \$25.00, the Ohio Lions Foundation gets \$15.00 to help build the Foundation funds for community grants to be used in all Lions Clubs communities should the need arise. Wooster and Dayton Lions Clubs each received grants for disaster relief efforts in their communities in the spring of 2019. The state, or course, gets a \$10.00 share of the fee to administer the program. Let's work together to build recognition and show our PRIDE in being a Lion who serves the community. "Amen!"

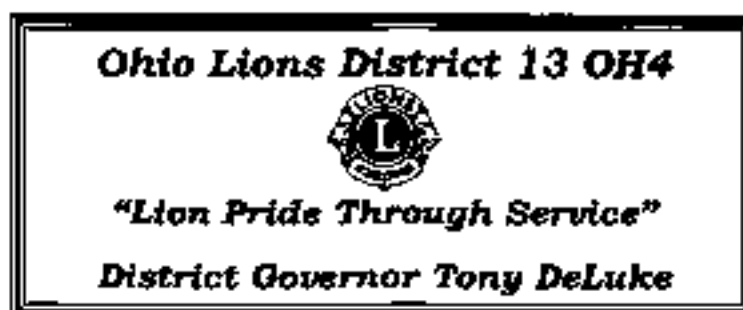

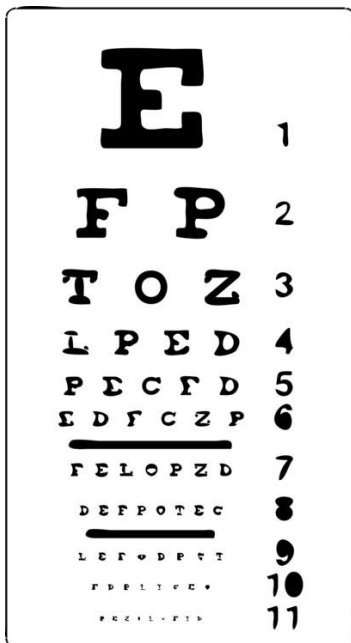

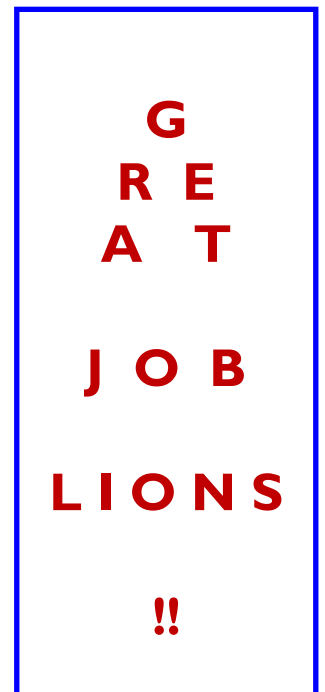
