Since we are not having a June Cabinet meeting, we will have to do the District Elections by online, snail mail or other methods. PCC Chuck Allcorn is working on the details. PARLIAMENTARIAN Report

Following April 18th Zoom Meeting

My apologies to all, I was not keeping secrets. I guess I just never thought of following through on the process (with all things occurring) to keep everyone informed. Also, unfortunately, I thought I had provided information for the district newsletter, which did not go out till MUCH later than I anticipated.

Not having a candidate for 2nd VDG and knowing of the delay in "voting process till May", I did take the liberty to seek a "last minute call" for letters of intent with an April deadline. I have received none.

Therefore, please let me highlight the action plan as mentioned during the recent ZOOM meeting.

I have taken the wait and see approach. I guess this is where/why I became lazy on information. Waiting to see if we will be assembling for our Multiple District Convention in May. If this occurs, notices will be sent to our District Clubs indicating that our District elections will occur during our District Caucuses at this convention (as per permitted by Constitution and By-Laws). This would be the easiest and least disruptive way to complete our District Elections, as required. Mailing labels are ready for each club Secretary for notification along with a "draft" email notice for Lion Joe Hall to post.

Should the Multiple District Convention be postponed or canceled, a plan is being developed to conduct the elections by possible electronic means and/or preferred USPS (snail) mail during the end of the month of May. That plan:

- a. Once we know there will be no MD 13 Convention, clubs/district will be notified that the elections will be completed by mail by district web options.
- b. Each club Secretary will be mailed a copy of the delegate form (which that club submitted) along with the number of permitted ballots, as per delegates listed, and a cover letter.

c. Cover letter will:

- 1) Ask/direct the Secretary to pass out the ballots to the designated delegates asking them to vote and return such.
- 2) Ask the secretary to initial the delegate form by each name that was provided a ballot, indicating that they are still in good standing with the Lions Club and were provided a ballot.
- 3) Collect the ballots and return as a complete group, to the designated address, with the completed delegated form (with requested notations). This way, we know that the club has voted its entitlement with no extras and the vote is still "somewhat secretive".
- 4) If Delegates return ballots on their own (with a secretary's notation that this is going to occur) I will ask the delegate to identify which Lions Club (no personal name) the ballot represents, to avoid extra votes (per club) to conform as a secret ballot with no personal identity attached.
- 5) Either way of ballot return, the Secretary must return delegate form with initials/notations for verifications and total vote count.
- d. I would like this to happen in a short time frame. ie: Post election notice, two week limit on mailing ballots out and returning, one week for mail delivery time. Three (3) days for a ballot count with (yet to form) election committee.

This is my drafted game plan. If any suggestions, please respond.

We do not have any "District Issues" to vote upon, but do have two (2) MD13 committee trustees to elect along with the District Officers. There are no contested positions, so a majority vote count will be required.

** As observer/director for all of our election committees, I can inform you that the nominating committee informally met March 7th, reviewed letters of intent and completed qualification checklists for all that were available. There are no "district issues" on the agenda requiring delegate votes.

Just to start priming the pump, I'll offer some of my thoughts.






Important Announcement Concerning Training For Vision Screeners in Schools



Tips for holding an online meeting

Meeting virtually may be a new experience for some Lions and is an exciting opportunity to use technology to continue vital club functions and outreach.

Below are a few virtual meeting best practices that can help make each event successful.

Prepare in advance of the meeting

- Schedule the event 1-2 weeks prior to announcing.
- Conduct a meeting dry-run through.
- Login early to the live meeting.

List important information

- Have an introduction slide answering common questions such as, "Will this be recorded?" and "How do I submit a question during the meeting?"
- Include screenshots where applicable.

Encourage interaction

- If applicable, ask everyone to introduce themselves.
- Pose relevant questions during the meeting.

Follow up with meeting participants

- Set expectations for the
 next communication
- Send the recording, meeting notes, and other relevant nextsteps

If your club has not held elections for the 2020-2021 Lion year commencing July 1, 2020, please do so immediately.

Election results must be reported to LCI within 15 days of the election on form PU101 Rev 3/20.

Clubs have the ability to conduct meetings via alternate means, such as teleconference, email or another method that is beneficial for a club. The Standard Club By-Laws, Article VI, Section 6 provides:

Regular and/or special meetings of this club and/or board of directors may be held through the use of alternative meeting formats, such as teleconference and/or web conference upon initiation of the President or by any three (3) members of the board of directors.

As you will note, the club president, or 3 members of the board, can call for a meeting to be held by alternative means. The manner in which this is conducted is at the discretion of the club.

Regarding the April 15 report date, we would urge clubs to try and comply with this obligation as they always have, but will not be penalizing clubs who report at a later time.

I trust I have provided guidance in this matter. Please let me know if I can be of further assistance.







King Lion Joan Ferris, **North Canton Lions**, reports that the club has been meeting every week in Zoom virtual meetings to visit and be supportive. Over 50% of the club is involved in these meetings. Great attendance! Through such meetings they have also moved forward with their annual scholarship program. The scholarship committee met, reviewed 10 applications and selected a recipient for the \$1,000 scholarship. The winner will not be announced until the scholarship is presented some time in the future. Good works continue!!

Zone 8 Chair Lion Haven Ackley has confirmed that clubs in **Zone 8** are staying active with planning for future events, holding club elections and using all means available to remain in contact. As for her home club, **Alliance Lions Club**, they are using Zoom, emails, phone calls and snail mail to stay in communication. Their election was scheduled for April 23 via Zoom meeting, with ballots distributed prior by email (and snail mail for members without email). Summer and fall events are still being planned. And, donations have been made to the Alliance Food Pantry and the local Salvation Army where the need for help has tripled.

Lion Haven recently experienced the following event that shows something good can result from something bad.

In early April her phone rang several times on a Saturday evening with a number she did not recognize. The caller did not leave a message. On the fourth time a voice did follow the rings to leave a message. The caller said "this is Karou calling from Japan".

Karou was a 4-year student at Mount Union who graduated 15 years ago, and had stayed with the Ackleys during the summer while in summer school. During the 30 minute call, Haven updated Karou on many things including the passing of Haven's husband Ed. Although hard for both of them, it also brought back many good memories of the times they all shared. Many that Haven had forgotten: dining out at different restaurants, stops for ice cream after dinner, Karou's appetite, even a trip to get ears pierced. Haven learned that Karou was married, her husband owns a Chinese restaurant and they were the parents of a 2 month old baby girl. Karou had called to see how the Ackleys were and if they were safe from the virus. A call that made Haven's day.

Your call could make the day for someone else.

Lion Ernie Richmann sent a Power Point presentation that he used in a Zoom meeting with the **Painesville Lions Club**. This was one of their first attempts with a virtual meeting. He said it went well with just some minor glitches. The presentation covered three main topics for these times: how to serve, where to find information and how to keep in contact with members. The presentation gave an example of one club conducting a virtual poster contest. It also gave tips on making masks. One chart in the Power Point listed a number of on-line sites where members could find information relative to Lions and to the community. A couple of slides listed members holding club positions and how to obtain contact information using the club website.

In another meeting, Joan Seidel, Kent Health Commissioner, gave an informative and timely update on the coronavirus epidemic in Kent. In both cases the presenters were "given permission to share" their presentations by DG Tony DeLuke who controlled the meetings. Using this method helps control who enters the meetings and the possibility of being hacked.

Jackson Township Lions Club has been very active and using the computer effectively per the following report submitted by Lion Ralph Manning.

We were able to process the Parade of Checks, authorized prior to the shutdown of no meetings. The Treasurer wrote checks to Amigos, Camp Echoing Hills, Diabetes Foundation, Juvenile Diabetes Foundation, International Relations, LCIF, MJ 13 OH4 ECF, Ohio Lions Eye Research, Ohio Lions Foundation & STEPS totaling \$3,400.

Additionally, a note detailing our promise of making a \$10,000 donation to Pilot Dogs was issued. On Saturday Apr 4th we had planned delivery of Roses for Fund Raising of this money. With the virus getting us caught in the Stay at Home world we have rescheduled this event to Saturday May 30th. We recently had a virtual meeting on Club business on Apr 16 using the program "Zoom".
