

Important Announcement Concerning Training For Vision Screeners in Schools UPDATE AS OF JUNE 26, 2020

Changes to Ohio law require that all persons participating in school vision screening of **kinder-gartners and 1st graders** must be certified by participating in 4-6 hours of online training. There are no changes from recent years for those screening 3rd graders and above.

- You will need to set up an account the first time that you go into the site.




