

Registration Deadline Extended

Due to the uncertainty of border restrictions, the Executive Committee approved extending the current registration fee of \$320 until August 15.

After that date, the registration fee increases to \$345, but more importantly, you are not guaranteed to be able get a hotel room. Contractually, we must release unused hotel rooms after that time, and we've recently learned that there is a country music concert in Wells Fargo Arena (adjacent to the lowa Events Center), and the lowa-lowa State football game (in nearby Ames). We expect this will create a higher demand of Des Moines hotel rooms for Saturday night.

COVID-19 PCR Testing and Current Protocols

To facilitate travel requirements, the Forum is arranging on-site COVID testing at the lowa Events Center on Friday Sept. 10. Results will be provided within 24 hours, and additional details for scheduling and paying for appointments online will be provided in the nest update.

The Forum will follow safety protocols in effect at the Iowa Events Center:

- 1. Face coverings are NOT required for fully vaccinated individuals (shots completed at least 14 days prior).
- 2. Face coverings ARE required for individuals NOT fully vaccinated.
- 3. As recommended by the CDC, it is recommended that masks be worn in large gatherings.
- 4. Hand sanitation stations will be available throughout the Iowa Events Center.

Note: These are subject to change according to state and federal revisions.





The 2021 Strides event at the Forum is going to be different this year! Instead of a traditional group "Walk", we are having a Scavenger Hunt with activities that can be completed throughout the Forum weekend. This has allowed us to move forward in our planning with participant safety and uncertainties around COVID and large/close groups in mind. Registered participants can pickup their shirts Thursday morning, and there will be a short informational kickoff.

NOTE: Lunch will NOT be provided as part of Strides this year, but healthy snack packs will be available for those who registered. This prevents food handling and distribution concerns, and allows us to keep our expenses lower so that more of the fee can be contributed to diabetes programs.

The USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum is excited to partner with Camp Hertko Hollow, the beneficiary for 2021 Strides funds raised. Camp Hertko Hollow, a 501(c)3 not-for-profit entity, is a member of the Diabetes Education and Camping Association (DECA) and is accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA). It's mission is to:

- Provide an educational and recreational camping program for lowa's youth between the ages of 5-17 who have diabetes.
- · Promote diabetes management skills.
- Help children gain independence and develop a positive attitude for controlling the disease.

Since 1968, Camp Hertko Hollow has provided a positive camping experience for over 15,000 children with diabetes. Campers are predominately lowa residents, however, it has a regional reputation of being a very well-run and fun diabetes camp. In 2019, 275 campers came from 130 towns across lowa as well as 47 campers from other states: Wisconsin (3), Texas (1), South Dakota (5), Missouri (11), Nebraska (11), Minnesota (1), and Illinois (15).

The cost to attend the week-long camp is \$650. However, the true cost of the program exceeds the fees charged; the actual cost of summer overnight camp is almost \$1,300 per camper. The generosity of families and other donors makes Camp Hertko Hollow a reality. No camper will be turned away due to an inability to pay. The goal is to be able to offer every child living with diabetes in lowa the opportunity to attend Camp Hertko Hollow, regardless of their financial situation. Financial assistance is available for those who cannot afford to pay the full fee.
