LCIF in Action: Emergency Response Team (ALERT) Project

The Lions of MD32-S of South Carolina's Lions Emergency Response Team (ALERT) Project:

A Disaster Relief grant from LCIF funded the purchase of a 6x12 foot enclosed trailer, emergency supplies such as snacks, beverages, and tools for cleanup and repairs in the event of a declared emergency/disaster in the state of South Carolina.

In addition, the team has held Emergency Preparedness Workshops at Lions Club meetings, community meetings, independent living facilities. The trailer has been on display at festivals and events where Emergency Preparedness Checklists are distributed.

The positive response to the organization of the ALERT Team, purchase of and equipping the trailer, and the workshops have been overwhelming throughout the district and various communities.

Eight volunteer committee members live throughout the District. In case of an emergency or disaster, the trailer will be deployed in the area. There are several Lions Clubhouses in the District that have agreed to be utilized as Command Centers and shelters.

This is just one of many ways that Lions can work together with LCIF to improve the lives of members of our communities by anticipating and preparing for possible disasters in our communities.

LCIF Grant Highlights: Leo Service Grants

The LCIF Leos Service Grants support Leos in assessing, planning, implementing their service projects.

- Amounts: Grants are available to Lions districts in amounts of \$1,500 to \$5,000.
- Local matching funds required: 25% of total project cost
- What does LCIF fund? Hands-on, community-based humanitarian service projects directly developed, implemented, and carried out by Leo Clubs, in collaboration with Lions
- Examples include:



- Leos painted, cleaned, and repaired a community center. Working together, Leos and Lions helped repair the building. The grant supported the purchase of paint, paint brushes, trash bags, and small repairs in the building.
 - Leos built a sensory garden in a playground for people with disabilities. Lions assisted the Leos to obtain necessary permits from local authorities. Leos and Lions did all of the labor to establish the garden. The grant supported the purchase of benches, plants, and paving stones.
 - Leos hosted a dinner for seniors by preparing and distributing meals. Lions supported Leos with fundraising matching funds and managing logistics. Grant funds were used to purchase food, plates, and utensils.

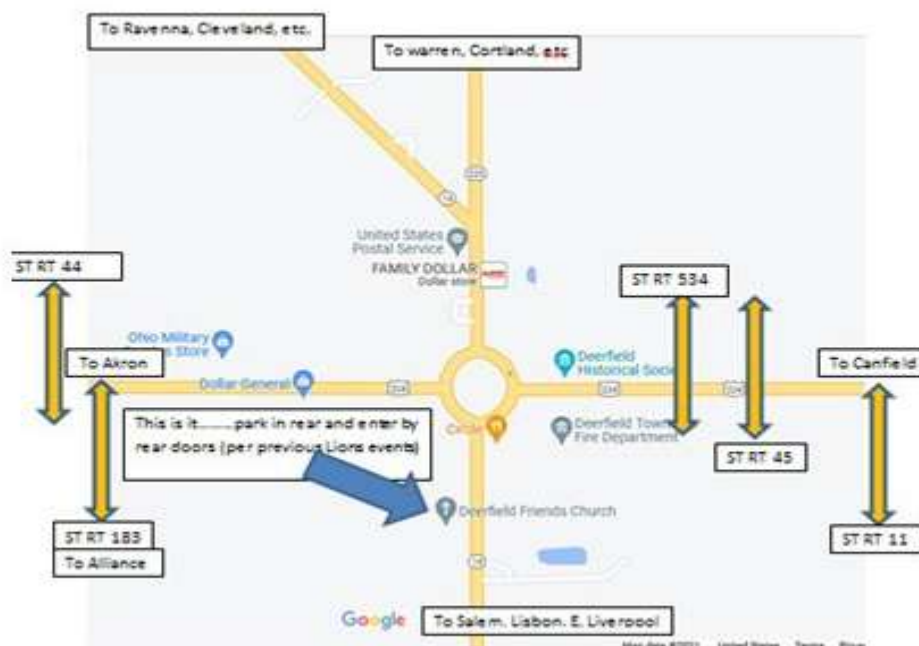

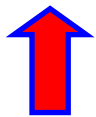

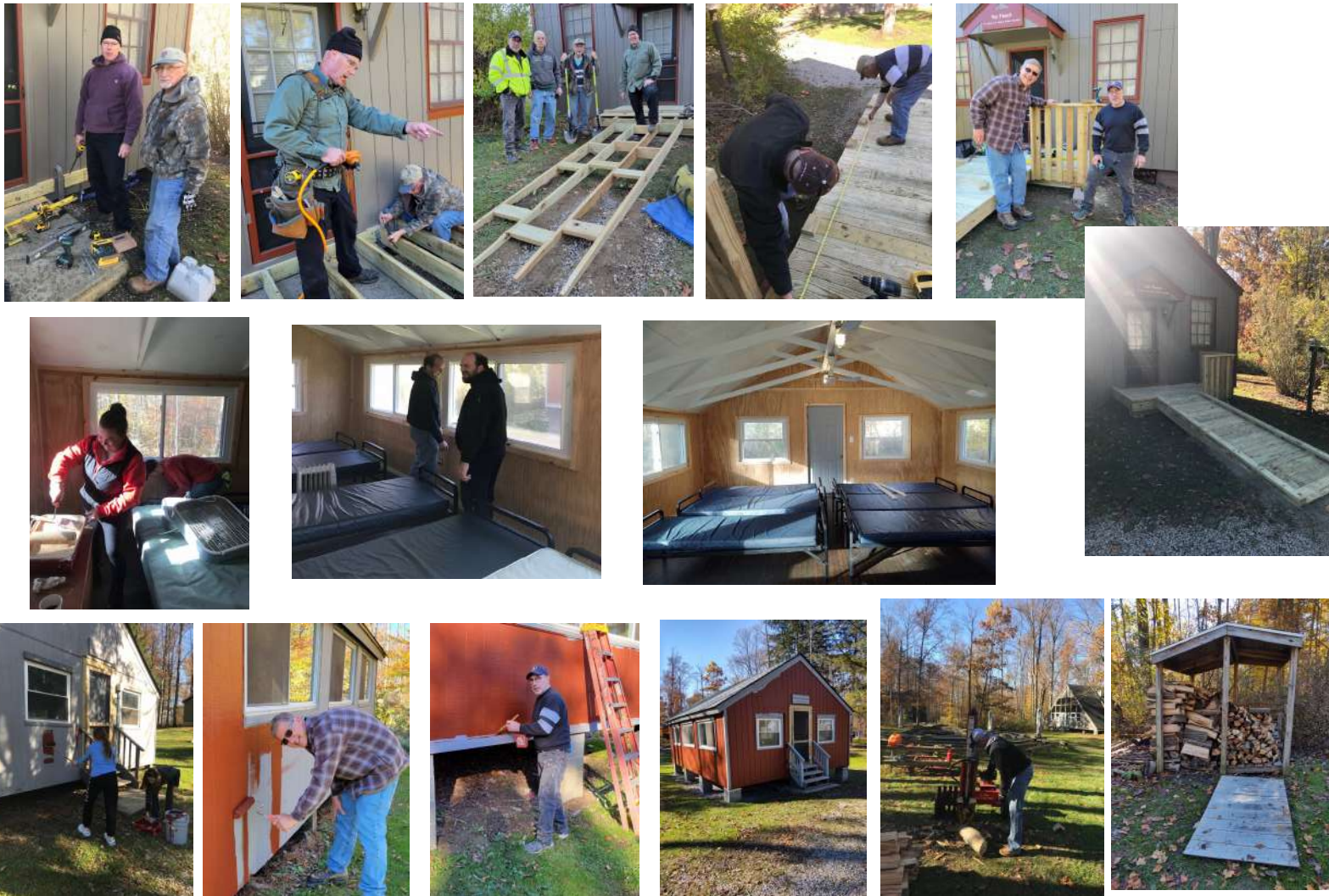
Camp Ho Mita Koda Workdays
