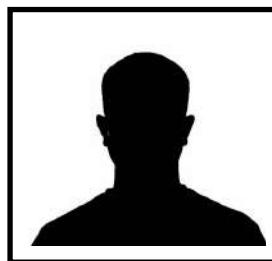

There is a wealth of information on the LCI webpage at www.lionsclubs.org to help you report your great service activities on MyLion. So far only 30% of the clubs are reporting their great service activities throughout the world. We can do better! When you visit the website and type in the magnifying icon “Service Reporting”, a wealth of step-by-step tools are available to help you. Directions on how to set up your MyLion account is presented. There also is a step-by-step guide titled “How to Report & Celebrate Service”. Included is a page “Measuring Service Impact” that explains why it is important to report service and a list of the types of activities to report. Just click on the “eye” icon of the titles and the printed materials appear. You are able to print them for future reference and use. Finally, do you know who is able to report service activities for your club? There are 4 individuals indicated by LCI. Each club's secretary, president, service chairman and club administrator can report service using their MyLion Account for the club. So, if you are relying on just your club's secretary you are missing an opportunity to be recognized when service reporting does not occur. Share the responsibility and assist the secretary on your club's service reporting!

As we enter November and a time for family celebration, let's look at the opportunities that we as Lions can learn new things and serve consistently in our communities. Let me leave you with this thought.

“We develop opportunities by applying persistence to possibilities. Opportunity is all around us. If we seek it, we will find it. If the door of opportunity is closed we must knock on it and keep knocking until the door opens.”

Hi Lions!

I just wanted to share a few thoughts about membership as we head into November and the busy holiday months. I've been asked by Governor Judy to share ideas with clubs relating to ideas from LCI in the area previously called NAMI, and now labeled Global Membership Approaches. No matter what you call it, there are some great suggestions and materials to help our clubs. We ordered enough printed materials so that each club could receive their own copies. They've been distributed at the Zone meetings.

No groaning allowed! (Or aloud!) I know people get tired of hearing about membership, but it is the heart of how we provide service. No members = no service!

To touch on one area included in the material: Membership Satisfaction. Some of our clubs have lost members during the past year. Whatever the reason, we need to be concerned about what makes us want to be Lions. I'll bet it isn't that we love boring meetings! I would suggest that your club officers truly consider some of these tools. Three assessments that I see to choose from are in "Club Quality Initiative", "Membership Satisfaction Guide", and "How Are Your Ratings?" Take time to look them over! Choose one and try it. The key to each is to truly ask and share with each other the strengths and weaknesses that might be part of your club. We can't fix any problems that might cause individuals to be disappointed or discouraged if we don't bring them forward and plan how to improve. We need to also celebrate what we're doing right. Positive service will attract others to serve.

Speaking of what we're doing right -- Take time to look at MyLion or club Facebook pages to see what great creative projects our district has put together during our "Fall In-to Service" week. It's so good to share ideas -- it's fine to "steal" from each other and modify to make a service project fit your club.

Don't forget to ask someone to join soon. Remember that the LCI \$35 waiver is good until the end of December.

LCIF Grant Highlights: Hunger Grants (Pilot Grant Program)

There are nearly one billion people across the world that experience food insecurity. No one can truly understand the devastating physical and emotional impact of hunger unless they experience it. Through the LCIF Hunger Pilot Grant Program, Lions can support school based feeding programs, food banks, feeding centers, and similar facilities that provide food to people when they need it most.

Hunger Pilot Grants (available to districts only, not clubs)

- Amounts: Grants are available to Lions districts in amounts of \$10,000 to \$100,000.
- What does LCIF fund? Large-scale infrastructure development projects focused on equipment acquisition for food banks, school kitchens, and food storage and transport. Examples include:
 - Construction or expansion of food banks, feeding centers, and food storage facilities
 - Construction or expansion of kitchen or dining facilities as part of a school based feeding program
 - Purchase of refrigerators and freezers to store perishable food items
 - Kitchen equipment such as stoves and ovens
 - Furniture such as chairs and tables for dining rooms and feeding centers
 - Vehicles to transport, collect, and deliver food
- Matching funds: 25% of total project cost

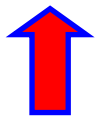

- Building two ramps to make two cabins handicap accessible. *
- Final touchups on paint/trim (if not already completed).
- Replacing broken split rail fencing.
- General cleanup of the grounds (leaves, sticks, etc).

Indoor work that needs completed:

- Staining of the wood paneling inside of the cabins.
- Final painting of one remaining room in the clinic.
- Installation of plexiglass covering for an artifact wall.
- Fixing a couple of broken building doors.
- Complete clear out of the maintenance shed, inventory of equipment, and putting it all back in an organized way.

* Priority item. *Need volunteers with expertise and abilities on building ramps.*

Staying over Saturday night is optional. Cabins will have bed frames, mattresses and heaters. Electricity will be working, as well as the water and restrooms in the clinic and kitchen. Only the bathhouse and pavilion will be shut down at that point. Folks will need to bring bedding, sleeping bag, pillow, etc.

You can bring your favorite tools for the jobs you want to do. Bring clothes to fit the weather. CHMK will have tools and supplies available if needed.
