District Governor Report June 2022



Happy spring Lions of OH4,



It is hard to believe that the last month of this Lions Year of 2021-2022 is here. It's a time for celebrations of all the hard work our Lions have completed through "SERVING" their communities, Ohio and World Wide. OH4 Lions are no exception! I congratulate you all on the projects you have all contributed to this year. As a District we have increased our visibility in so many ways. The Trex program with 33 clubs taking part has removed over 25 TONS of plastic from our landfills. When the State Council of Governors asked for your help for Kentucky you responded with monetary donations and totes of much needed supplies for those 7 communities that lost housing for at least 1/3 of their population. The projects in your communities are beginning to return to pre-pandemic times as was indicated with Districts OH4 service reporting at 100%. Thank you everyone for submitting or providing information so that the entire State of Ohio reached the 100% challenge in reporting each clubs service activities. You indeed roar loudly!

The DGe Team of Lion Carol, Lion Janet, Lion Bill and I had the honor of representing you recently at the Ohio State Lions Convention in Columbus. It was a great weekend of recognizing Lions throughout Ohio for their exceptional service to others. Our incoming International President, First Vice President Brian Sheehan was indeed a highly motivating speaker. He praised Ohio about the importance of "Team Work" used to reach 100% reporting of service activities in Multiple District 13. Last year only 52% of Ohio Clubs reported service. In that year 860,000 people were served. This year with 100% of our club reporting, Ohio Lions documented there where 2.6 million people served in this Lion year of 2021-2022. We still have ONE more month of reporting so let's add some more service hours and document the people we serve on MyLion.

Lion Brian praised the teams of each Ohio District for having a great attitude by working with "Big Changes" during these past 2 years with pandemic protocols. Ohio found a way to serve despite the challenges and restrictions. Ohio Lions tried new ways through technologies to stay in contact with each other and plan community service projects. He challenged everyone

to continue to move forward with the skills in technology we learned these past years. Please do not go backwards as our future depends on progressive techniques. They have a place and are another way of doing business as Lions.
