

Welcome to September! Many of our clubs are gearing up for work at various county fairs, some screening eyes, some with food booths, all putting themselves out there in public view to market our great organization. (My own Magnolia Club's annual sponsorship of Canal Days is one example of fun activity together with fundraising from hayrides, bingo and ice cream sales.) Picnics and new officer celebration times have been positive fellowship events of our clubs. Service hours go so much faster when fun and fellowship are involved. I am so looking forward to the next couple of months where I'm scheduled to visit many of your clubs and events.

The first district cabinet meeting was recently held, all present officers having time to report, plus some extra time spent dealing with finance issues related to our new Cabinet Treasurers coming on board. A special meeting was later held to approve the budget. Zone Chairs are taking the reins and eager to work, as well as a new Membership Retention team formed to work closely within the zones.

We're gearing up for events and hours of service; So far showing 133 service activities reported, with 28,000 people served and \$19,570 funds donated. These figures don't closely reflect all the service, as it represents about half of our clubs, Leos included. We have some work ahead to get all the clubs on board with reporting their activities, our goal being 100% reporting during the FY. Think positive! Fall is a great time of year to organize an event to introduce friends to the joy we find in our service organization. The Lions Club International Convention is returning to the United States - Boston July 2023!



If you have not made your reservation yet, please do so right now by calling 216-363-2500 and leave a message indicating whether you will joining us for cake and beverages, or just the meeting. The cost for refreshments will be \$5 per person.

To bring you up to date, since January 2022 we have reviewed 80+ applications for eye exams and/or glasses. The count is down due to Covid and vacation schedules of the staff at Geauga Vision and their satellite locations, as well as not as many referrals from the clubs. But, the numbers should increase soon.

If you hear of someone who needs eye care and cannot afford it, please refer them to us. It is our mission to see that no person is deprived of the gifts of sight and hearing. Applicants for hearing aids are referred to the Greater Akron Lions Hearing Aid Program.

For those new to this program, our primary purpose is providing eye exams, glasses, eye surgeries, prosthetic eyes and/or equipment to people in need. We do charge a nominal fee to assure the appointments will be kept and glasses are not left with the provider. We also collect used eye glasses, which are cleaned, measured, and packed in boxes for mission trips.

We look forward to seeing you September 7th. If you cannot make it, please mark your calendar for Wednesday, November 2nd and plan to join us.
