

The Melvin Jones Fellowship Program



The Melvin Jones Fellowship Program is a generous way to show commitment to the humanitarian work of LCIF.

The MJF Program was established in 1973 in honor of Melvin Jones, the founder of Lions Clubs International. The MJF program recognizes donations of US\$1,000 to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

New MJFs receive a pin, commemorative plaque and a letter from the LCIF Chairperson. If the donor so chooses, he/she may use their donation credit to recognize another individual with a MJF.



The Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship Program

The Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship (PMJF) provides an opportunity to advance in the Fellowship program. For each subsequent donation of US\$1,000 beyond the initial MJF donation, donors receive a unique PMJF pin in accordance with their level of giving. Like MJFs, donors can recognize another individual with PMJF donations.

Areas of Giving

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) will now be able to help more people than ever before by making an even greater global impact with a focus on vision, youth, disaster relief and humanitarian work. Donors will receive MJF and PMJF credit when directing their support to:


- . The Empowering Service Fund
- The General Disaster Fund

Empowering Service Fund: Any of LCIF's causes (sight, youth, disaster relief, humanitarian support, diabetes, childhood cancer, hunger, the environment).

Disaster Relief: Enables LCIF to direct the funds to the area's most in need following disasters to provide for immediate, mid and long-term relief. The Foundation will be able to immediately provide funds for large-scale disaster relief, rather than collecting and distributing funds over a period of weeks or months.

Did you know...

Districts, clubs and individuals can donate to LCIF through the Melvin Jones Fellowship Program, but only an individual can receive the recognition. MJF applications using collective donations from multiple donors must be accompanied by written consent from all donors to use their donations for MJF recognition for the individual specified on the application.

Melvin Jones Fellowships can be named in honor or in memory of an individual.

Melvin Jones Fellowships do not need to be paid in full at one time; minimum installments to LCIF of US\$100 can be paid over a five-year period to total US\$1,000, at which time the MJF Application is completed.

Our primary purpose is to provide eye exams, glasses, eye surgeries, prosthetic eyes and/or special equipment for people in need of eyecare wherever they reside. There appears to be no duplication of services in OH3 and OH4 due to location restrictions by some Lions' organizations.

Examples of our services are: over 90 applications have been reviewed and processed since January, sight equipment has been purchased for the Sunbeam School students, vision medical supplies were purchased for a mission trip to Honduras, several individuals have been referred and given cataract surgery, a lady from Kentucky who had cancer behind her eye received financial help with her doctor's bill and transportation to and from the airport and hotel in the Cleveland Clinic area, Orcam MyEye Pro equipment was purchased for a gentleman from Scio, Ohio, and reading glasses have been provided for the psych/addiction patients on the 4th floor at the St. Vincent Charity Medical Center.

Presently, we are working with the Greater Akron Eyecare Program to procure a prosthetic eye for a gentleman from Youngstown, Ohio, who moved from Missouri.

International has sent us referrals and so has the following OH4 Clubs: Ashtabula, North Coast, Painesville, and Youngstown. Through our website, we have had requests for assistance from Florida and California, which we referred to more local Lions Clubs.

We have been receiving requests from various preschools and nurses regarding vision screening. These tests will begin in November.






District Lions,

Vision screening by Lions clubs appears to be back in full swing after the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years were hampered due to covid. To date, the following clubs have reported that they have conducted screening for preschoolers, kindergartners, elementary, middle school and/or high school age students:

Ashtabula Canal Fulton Uniontown
Calcutta Jackson Twp Massillon
Boardman North Coast Homeworth

Hartville

In addition, multiple clubs have reported that they participated in vision screening of children and adults at two county fairs (Portage/Randolph and Mahoning/Canfield) and at the MAPS/SAM Veterans Resource Fair.

So far this service to the communities has resulted in:

Number referred for further evaluation 784
Percentage referred for further evaluation 14.3 %

A TIBBIT OF INFORMATION:

Parliamentarian says beware......BE PREPARED......Do Not Rob from the public.

If your Lions Club operates on the Calendar year instead of the Lions Fiscal year - be sure you are prepared for the known (and possible) dues increase(s) to be effective July 1st, 2023.

In July 2022, Lions International adopted A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE <u>SEMI-ANNUAL</u> INTERNATIONAL DUES TO BE PHASED IN OVER THREE CONSECUTIVE YEARS BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024.

- It was resolved that effective July 1, 2023, Article XII, Section 2(a) of the International By-Laws be amended by increasing dues \$1.50.
 - \$1.50 x 2 = \$3.00 / year
- IT WAS FURTHER RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2024, Article XII, Section 2(a) of the International By-Laws be amended by increasing dues another \$1.00.
 - \circ \$1.00 x 2 = \$2.00 / year
- IT WAS THEN FURTHER RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2025, Article XII, Section 2(a) of the International By-Laws be amended by increasing dues another \$1.00.
 - \circ \$1.00 x 2 = \$2.00 / year
- This amounts to a Known \$7.00 yearly increase after the third full year.

Now the *MD13 Constitution & By-Laws Chr. has informed* the District OH4 Officers that language was approved for a ballot proposal (to the Delegates) at the 2023 annual State Convention, to raise dues \$5.00, effective July 1st, 2023. This will be contingent on the voting in May. *This means a possible* additional increase.

Therefore, please prepare your billings accordingly so you are not caught with a subsidy to your club's administration operations with public (gained) funds.

Thursday night, Oct 13, the **Conneaut Lions Club** had its annual Seal Stuffing Night. Each year we stuff about 2,500 envelopes with sight-saving seals and requests for donations to help the club pay for eye exams and corrective lenses for those in the community who cannot afford them. We were fortunate to be joined by DG Carol Snyder and her husband PDG Lion Jeff, as well as 1st VDG Janet Christen and her husband PDG Wayne Christen.

The **Painesville Lions Club** held their Sweetest Day Rose Sale during "Fall Into Service" week. Unsold roses were donated to the Brookdale Senior Living Facility. The Painesville Lions also collected items for the Painesville Schools Resource Center (an ongoing project) at the Sweetest Day Rose Sale.











As part of a larger "Fall into Service" effort, the **Conneaut Lions Club** offered native beardtongue plants to passers-by Saturday at Ed Malek Park while they did some cleanup at the Native Nursery on the walking trail. Cooler weather and some rain cut the project short, so club members plan to return later in the month to finish their work and distribution of the perennial wildflowers.

The Native Nursery was planted two years ago to encourage the community to grow natives in their own landscapes. Only native plants serve as hosts for pollinators such as monarch butterflies and spicebush swallowtails. Many birds depend on natives as a food source for seeds and nectar.

Lion Encie Moroski, an Ashtabula County master gardener volunteer, advises gardeners not to cut down their natives in the fall for that reason. "Besides," she says, "the seed heads of ironweed, coneflowers and other natives will provide winter interest in the garden and attract songbirds."

She also suggests that gardeners not rake leaves out of the flower beds until later in the spring. Many beneficial insects, like the great spangled fritillary and wooly bear caterpillars, burrow under leaves for the winter. Additionally, other critters hibernate there—spiders, snails, worms, beetles, and more—that support the chipmunks, turtles, birds, and amphibians that rely on these insects for food.

The Native Nursery is just one of the projects supported by the Conneaut Lions Club. Among other efforts, they host Safety Town every summer, provide eye exams and corrective lenses to families with limited resources and raise money for scholarships to graduating Conneaut seniors.



The Lions Club International Convention is returning to the United States - Boston July 2023!


