District Governor Report January 2023



Happy New Year OH4:

As you know, this is the time of year when we are encouraged to think back and think ahead, like what's represented by the Lion's head on our logo: remembering a proud past and optimistically looking forward to the future, a brand new year! I hope that we can all face it with positive ideas and plans. I've enjoyed seeing lots of our Lions leaders in club and zone meetings thus far and continue to have travel plans for visits in the upcoming months.

Do you have "New Year resolutions"? I think that ordinarily means a person realizes that something in his/her life needs some improvement, or there's something new to be accomplished that hadn't yet been tried. For example, I could say that I need to lose some weight, but I honestly know that isn't going to happen if I don't have a plan of what needs to change: awareness of food choices and balancing calories with increased exercise. Now apply that idea to your Lions club. In leadership terminology, that's called setting goals and formulating the action steps needed to achieve the goals.

One of our district's goals is to have 100% service reporting. We're on our way with 75% showing on Ohio records, so there are still actions needed by some clubs to "step up" and learn the process. I know our district leaders encourage each month and offer help along the way. Perhaps a tech-savvy member can offer help to a struggling secretary.

Another goal is to provide orientation and retention programs so that we retain 90% of our current membership. So far our numbers show that we've lost 70 members since July I, which includes I5 who have passed away. New and old Lions need to learn and be reminded of objectives such as "being united in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding." (Quote from the "New Member Orientation Guide" that is one resource on <u>lionsclubs.org</u>.) It is about

20 pages long, and I am attaching 2 pages from the guide at the end of this report. Take a look and consider using it with your club. I can get you a printed copy if you prefer. I suggest small segments rather than trying the whole thing at once. Have fun with the process. Maybe hold a contest with small prizes? (Some clubs like Calcutta give each new member a notebook to peruse at their own timeframe.) Building a spirit of fun and respect can make our members want to participate and feel the joy of being needed in the service we provide. The "Just Ask!: Fostering a Culture of Recruitment" is another guide for gaining and keeping members. I have enough copies of that to give to each club's membership chair.

Lions were chosen as our symbol because they represent "strength, courage, fidelity and vital action". May our clubs be seen that way in our communities and our world. Let's find the joy in service and keep asking others to volunteer with us. Did you know that studies show that volunteers live longer than those who don't share their time and energy? That's a good point in recruitment.

I will try to share some more ideas about District and Club goals in the months to come.


