That word "change" keeps coming up in our communication this year for at least two reasons. One, International President Dr. Patti Hill's motto is "Changing the World." I really like her idea that by making small choices we decide how our future will unfold. Given that we, MD13, are an organization of over 9000 members and that we have demonstrated we know how to work together, we can make a big difference in our world by many "small" efforts. These "small" changes aren't really changes at all. They are common sense solutions to prevent members from losing interest in the club. Strong clubs do these things routinely. Strong clubs find ways to serve their communities, motivate their members to participate in that service, and recognize their members need to be appreciated so the clubs can prosper and grow as they add new members who want to "change their world" by serving their fellows in need.

One change we made at our first Council of Governors Meeting was to create an ad hoc committee to explore the NewVoices platform. In doing this, we aim to not only add members, but to listen better to current members who feel they aren't heard.

Driving T1D Cures Forward, Faster

Through our commitment and focus, JDRF has played a role in nearly every major type 1 diabetes (T1D) advance—every drug, device, cell therapy. People with T1D are doing better today, thanks to significant investments by JDRF to improve the lives of millions affected by the disease. There's never been a more exciting time for T1D research. Cures are a matter of when, not if. JDRF is moving us forward toward that day, faster.

Club Reports

The **Ashtabula Lions Club** screened the eyes of 100 children at the Back To School Bash on August 16, 2023. The Lions Club conducted the vision screenings to provide early detection of risk factors such as Amblyopia (lazy eye), Myopia (nearsightedness), Hyperopia (farsightedness), Astigmatism (problem focusing), and Gaze Asymmetry (misalignment between right & left eyes). We referred 11 children to an eye care provider for comprehensive vision examination based on our results. Trying to preserve children's eye sight is one of the Lions Club Global Causes. The other Global Causes are Diabetes; Environment; Hunger and Childhood Cancer. Below is Ashtabula County Commissioner J.P. Ducro (left) who inspects the Lions Eyes. He is also a Lion member. Lion Kathy Ray (center) and Gary VanDerlind (right) conducted the eye screenings using the PlusOptix Screener shown.

The **Lions Clubs of Zones 4 & 5** made their presence well known at the Portage County Fair in Randolph on August 22-27. **Rootstown Lions** manned their permanent sandwich stand during the fair. There was a display with club banners, other Lions' banners, red-white-blue patriotic banners and a map showing all the Lions clubs of Portage County and all the King Lion contact information. Seven clubs (**Brimfield, Kent, Randolph, Ravenna, Southeast, Suffield and Windham**) had Lions do eye screening of children (and a few adults) using PlusOptix screeners all week. Altogether Lions served 262 hours doing 1,397 screenings. 82 children were referred to have follow-up professional eye exams. See photos on next page.

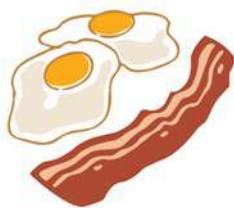

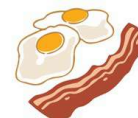
