

Driving T1D Cures Forward, Faster

Through our commitment and focus, JDRF has played a role in nearly every major type 1 diabetes (T1D) advance—every drug, device, cell therapy. Club Reports

The **Ashtabula Lions Club** screened the eyes of 100 children at the Back To School Bash on August 16, 2023. The Lions Club conducted the vision screenings to provide early detection of risk factors such as Amblyopia (lazy eye), Myopia (nearsightedness), Hyperopia (farsightedness), Astigmatism (problem focusing), and Gaze Asymmetry (misalignment between right & left eyes). We referred 11 children to an eye care provider for comprehensive vision examination based on our results. Trying to preserve children's eye sight is one of the Lions Club Global Causes. The other Global Causes are Diabetes; Environment; Hunger and Childhood Cancer. Below is Ashtabula County Commissioner J.P. Ducro (left) who inspects the Lions Eyes. He is also a Lion member. Lion Kathy Ray (center) and Gary VanDerlind (right) conducted the eye screenings using the PlusOptix Screener shown.

The Lions Clubs of Zones 4 & 5 made their presence well known at the Portage County Fair in Randolph on August 22-27. Rootstown Lions manned their permanent sandwich stand during the fair. There was a display with club banners, other Lions' banners, red-white-blue patriotic banners and a map showing all the Lions clubs of Portage County and all the King Lion contact information. Seven clubs (Brimfield, Kent, Randolph, Ravenna, Southeast, Suffield and Windham) had Lions do eye screening of children (and a few adults) using PlusOptix screeners all week. Altogether Lions served 262 hours doing 1,397 screenings. 82 children were recferred to have follow-up professional eye exams. See photos on next page.
